Be regular, be consistent, and always follow the rules. These habits are key to long-term success.

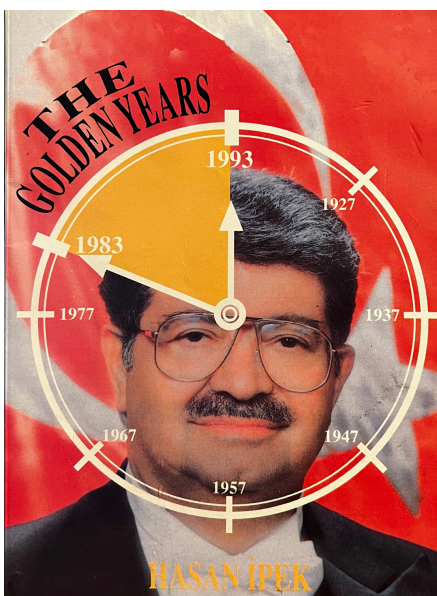

Bet you didn't know our school director is also an author! From helpful grammar guides to exciting novels, their books show a whole other side of their creativity. It's pretty inspiring to know our director doesn't just lead the school, they lead with their love of learning too!



Hasan İpek's Book: The Golden Years
This heartfelt work blends memoir and history, focusing on two main subjects: the author's own journey as an English teacher addressing Turkish students' language challenges, and his deep admiration for Turgut Özal, Turkey's 8th President.

The narrative weaves together İpek's educational mission—seen in works like *Simplified English Grammar**—with intimate recollections of Özal's life, from his 1987 heart surgery in Houston to his sudden death in 1993. Personal anecdotes highlight their close bond and shared dedication to Turkey's progress.

Cultural snapshots, like a 1925 marriage story and Özal's love for Middle Asian traditions, add richness. Though occasionally fragmented, the book serves as a warm tribute to leadership, education, and national pride, anchored by the theme that "Nobody can kill a person whom Allah spares."

A concise yet moving reflection on legacy, language, and loyalty.

The *Nightingale* is a moving tale of survival, resistance, and the unbreakable bonds of family, set against the harrowing backdrop of Nazi-occupied France during World War II. The novel follows two sisters, Vianne and Isabelle, who are forced to navigate the horrors of war in very different ways. Vianne, a schoolteacher and mother, must endure the hardships of occupation while trying to keep her daughter safe, even as a German officer is billeted in her home. Isabelle, rebellious and fiercely brave, joins the French Resistance, risking her life to help Allied airmen escape across the Pyrenees mountains.



Looking to master English grammar in a clear and practical way? This book (**Simplified English Grammar "For Turks"**), by Hasan İpek is the perfect guide for students at any level! Whether you're in school or university, this book breaks down complex rules with easy-to-understand explanations, everyday language, and helpful timelines. 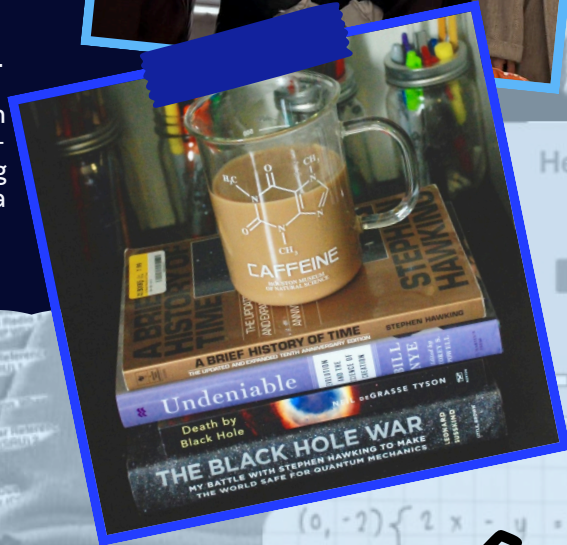




Teacher SPOTLIGHT

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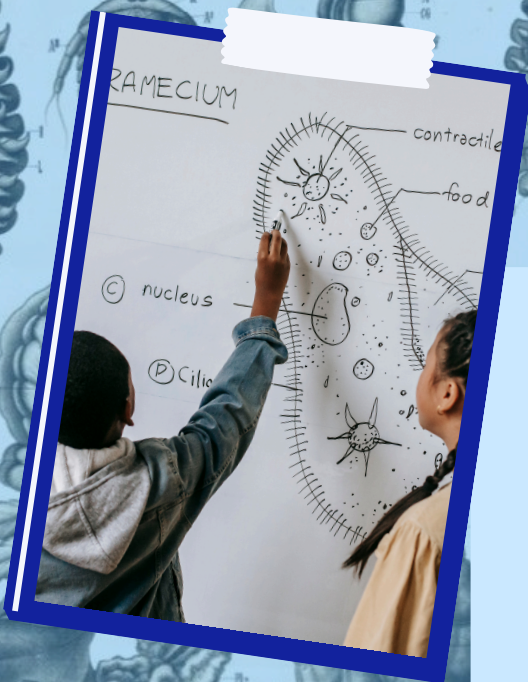

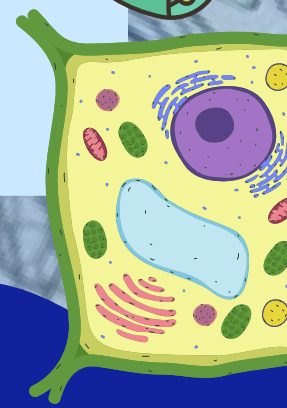
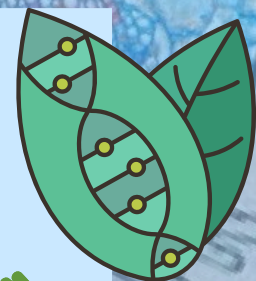
Teacher SPOTLIGHT

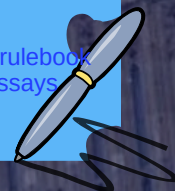
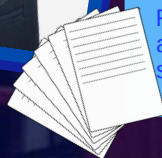


More about Miss Ruvi

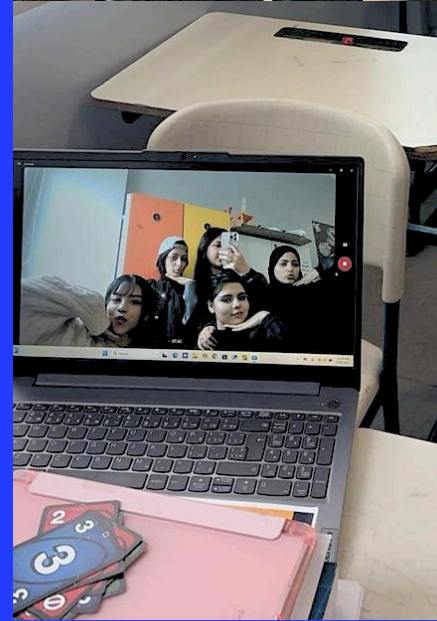

Fun fact: She has a way of making grammar seem less like a rulebook and more like a toolkit for life. And somehow, even complex essays start to feel doable when she's around.

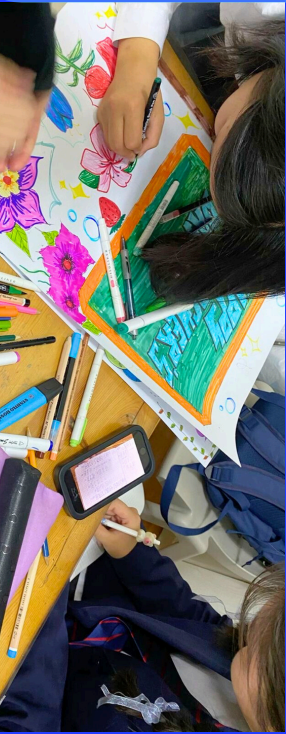

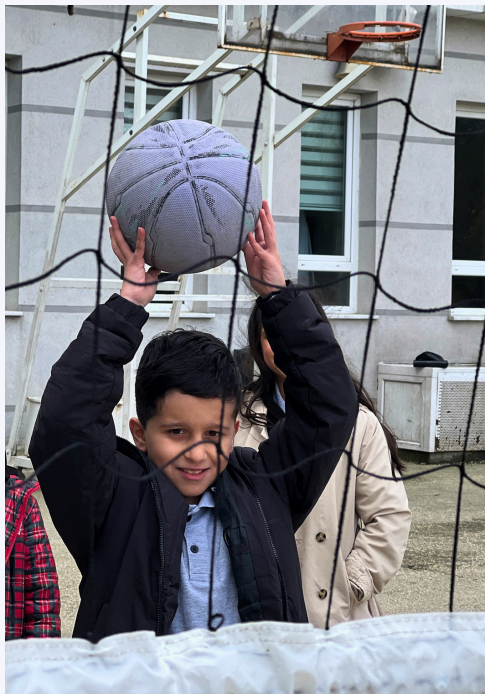
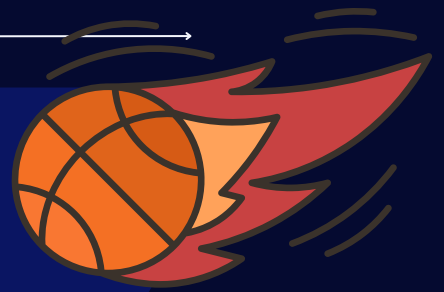

3. What's your favorite memory from playing on the team so far?

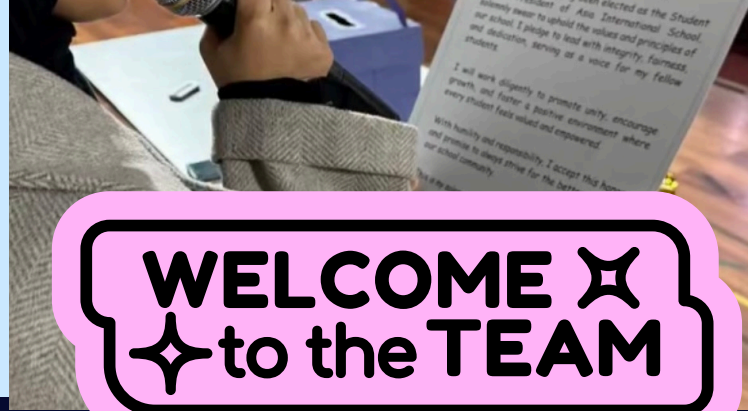

Whether it was testing homemade catapults, demonstrating the laws of motion, or even exploring magnetism and electricity, students proved that science is anything but boring.

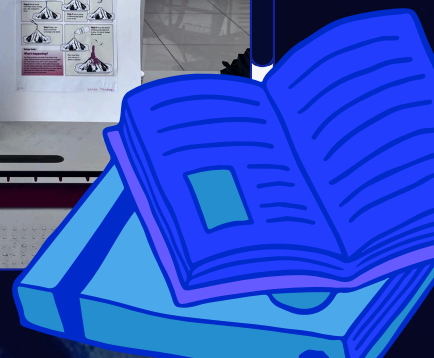
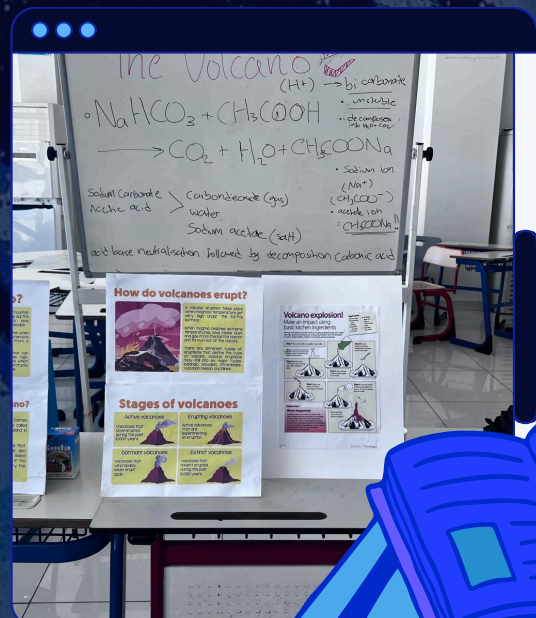
Asia students worked hard to create exciting, hands-on projects that explored the forces and wonders of the physical world.

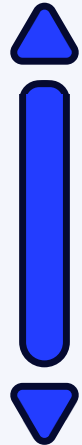

Grade 12A sparked a wave of school spirit with their fun and creative idea: Anything But a Backpack Day!

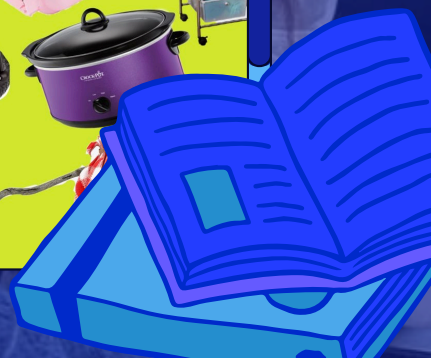
Students were challenged to carry their books and supplies in anything except a regular backpack — and they delivered with style.
